Almaty, 18 November 2009

SEMINAR REPORT

Opening of the Workshop

Chair: Juerg Staudenmann (UNDP-BRC)

Welcoming Remarks: Mr. Haoliang Xu (UNDP Resident Representative); Mr. Rafael Aguirre Unceta (EC Delegation); Mr. Ibatulin (Chairman of IFAS), Countries representatives – Mr. Anvar Zoirov (Tajikistan), Mr. Essen Zhusumatov (Kyrgyzstan).

In the opening session the opening remarks were given by representative of UNDP, EC Delegation, EC IFAS and Tajikistan and Kyrgyzstan country representatives.

Mr. Juerg Staudenmann (Water UNDP Bratislava Regional Centre) shortly introduced the purpose of the Inception Workshop, summarizing the activities which have been done so far in the frame of the inception phase, and invited participants to be active in discussion, give opinions and help to steer directions the project should go.

Mr. Haoliang Xu (UN Resident Representative / Coordinator -UNDP Kazakhstan) stressed importance of water resources management for all CA countries, mainly due to the fact that most of the rivers are transboundary. He pointed out that UNDP is committed to support the regional cooperation and it is in a position to support different activities and tasks in the region, through cooperation also with other UN agencies and other partners.

Mr. Rafael Aguirre Unceta (First Counselor and Regional Coordinator - EC Delegation to Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan and Tajikistan), representing the project key partner, informed about the EU Pilot partnership strategy with CA, adopted in 2007, which has several focal areas of cooperation, among which are energy, transport, water and environment and education. It is important to cooperate and work in a coordinated way in all countries within the whole region. He also stressed the important role of the revitalized IFAS in regional cooperation, which has now clear and stronger mandate.

Mr. Saghit Ibatulin (Chairman of EC-IFAS) confirmed that IFAS considers the EU-UNDP Project as extraordinary important for the whole region. IWRM brings a new philosophy and it is important for not only for the two countries where the project has started but for the whole CA region.

Mr. Anvar Zoirov (Deputy Minister from Ministry of Land Reclamation and Water Resources of Tajikistan) pointed out the importance of the International *Decade for Action 'Water for Life'* 2005-2015, MDGs with priority on civil development. Together with UNDP, Tajikistan wants to be part of the process, where Tajikistan`s objective is to get attention of governments and donors to comprehensive approach to issues related to water supply, hydropower, disaster recovery and security of resources. Mr. Esen Zhusumatov (Deputy Director of Kyrgyz Water Industry Department at the Ministry of Agriculture, Water and Processing Industry) mentioned the main issues related to IWRM which is the way to future food, energy and economic security in CA. Attention should be paid not only to energy distribution and management of water resources, but also to economic and energy security. Countries in CA, regardless of borders and economic situation, have understanding

and engagement in cooperation to conserve and manage water resources taking into account energy, food, economic and environment security.

Session 1: Presenting the Project

In this session a general overview of the EU-UNDP project was presented - regional component and national components by respective project coordinators - and discussed with workshop participants.

Ms. Natalia Alexeeva (UNDP/BRC Water Program Coordinator) provided a brief description of the project with focus on the Regional component.

Discussion

Several clarification questions were answered and points made from the side of participants. Questions were related to the budget, general approach - using "national projects instead of complex transboundary deals" and kind of scientific capacities are going to be used in the project.

Mr. Tulegen Sarsembekov (Eurasian Development Bank) pointed out importance of the International *Decade for Action 'Water for Life' 2005-2015*, to which the projects should be linked in general. He suggested to include actions in the national and regional level related to the objectives of International action decade; to organize project interactions and national conferences, where outcomes for the project can be viewed and made connections to water for life action decade.

Presentation of national components

National Component - Tajikistan

Mr. Anatoly Kholmatov –National Programme Coordinator for Tajikistan component - presented planned activities and status of the project implementation. Specific attention was given to national structures related to water resources and basin management – specific expert working groups in Tajikistan.

Discussion

Mr. Sukhrob Khoshmukhamedov (UNDP Tajikistan) provided additional information on UNDP activities related to Communities development programme that will be synchronized with the UNDP activities in water sector. He also clarified that of the IWRM project and SDC project implemented by UNDP-Tajikistan will be synchronized.

Mr. Andrey Barannik (USAID) suggested that UNDP contacts the USAID office in Tajikistan as USAID will be continuing Water Users Associations' support in Tajikistan. Therefore, USAID and UNDP should be in contact to fine-tune and coordinate the project activities.

Mr. Giovanni Munoz (FAO) confirmed that FAO is supporting the government/ministries of Tajikistan to support water sector, specifically in development of irrigation strategy and framework status for water user association and this work could be of use for this project.

Several participants pointed out necessity to have specification of targets and indicators for the project, e.g. on improvement of irrigation, access to drinking water, etc.

Mr. Juerg Staudenmann clarified, that the indicators and targets are already proposed - qualitative and quantitative in the overall log-frame. The targets will be reviewed and quantified within detailed work planning, for all coming years and in particular for the next year.

There was a short discussion on relation of the EU-UNDP project to any energy projects in the region. Mr. Staudenmann clarified that there is a certain relation, however it is not a really intention to work on large energy issues there are already other projects with UNDP, where we work with partners like World Bank and other partners.

Another question raised was on the expected results / actual deliverables of the project and linkages between sub-components and how they feed into IWRM Plan; and their coordination.

Ms. Natalia Alexeeva explained that coordination of outputs will be done at different levels of the project – country-wise coordination and thematic coordination.

National Component - Kyrgyzstan

Mr. Ryspek Apasov –National Programme Coordinator for Kyrgyzstan component presented the national project – budget, planned actions and activities.

Discussion

In the discussion several participants briefly informed about activities already carried out by their organizations, that could be relevant to the project, e.g. “National Water Dialogue” seminars in CA, organized by CAREC; work done at Isfara region by SDC, GTZ and CAREC etc. Importance to have Uzbekistan on board was specifically mentioned.

Participants pointed out the need for coordination among agencies and institutions, close cooperation with beneficiaries to ensure the national ownership, as well as to take into account ongoing and planned work.

Ms. Natalia Alexeeva confirmed, that the work in the Isfara region will be confirmed if Kyrgyzstan and Tajikistan are ready to cooperate in this basin. Participation of Uzbekistan will be ensured as well.

National Component - Kazakhstan

Ms. Inkar Kadyrzhanova (UNDP Kazakhstan – Head of Energy and Environment Unit) presented Kazakhstan National Project briefly giving the background on previous IWRM project implemented by UNDP and then coming to current project budget, activities and proposed time-frames. She pointed out that the national component will use already available results from previous projects and it will closely cooperate with other two national components.

Session 2: Project activities in the national and sub-regional context

Chair: Natalia Alexeeva (UNDP-BRC)

At this session the official project partners from CA countries informed about relevant IWRM activities and views on the EU-UNDP project.

Mr. Anvar Zoirov (Tajikistan) confirmed that the water issues have been actively discussed in Tajikistan and are among the most priority directions for state interventions. He underlined importance of the EU-UNDP project coordination with other activities and utilizing experience already accumulated.

Tajikistan has some experience with practical implementation of IWRM - for example a state concept for rational use of water resources, strategy for development of water sector, strategy for development of energy sector, and other activities and documents.

Ms. Natalia Alexeeva appreciated commitment to IWRM on such high level in Tajikistan. She informed about the intention to start the project ASAP, however planning phase, dialogue and putting details are important for success of the project activities.

Mr. Esen Zushumatov (Kyrgyzstan) pointed out that IWRM for CA countries might take different forms as state priorities are different (for Kyrgyzstan it is water/energy security, for Uzbekistan - food security). Therefore there is a need to have a comprehensive approach; all priorities need to be seen in one context. Kyrgyzstan is trying to work in line with international standards to improve management of water resources. There is a progress in irrigation practices, water saving.

Mr. Talaipek Makeyev (CAREC) pointed out importance of country ownership for the project. There should be consistency, realistic project evaluation. In IWRM – UNDP has good opportunity to

promote the existing tools and mechanisms - economic instruments that can be applied, study on economic tools and investments.

Ms. Natalia Alexeeva confirmed that there is also an economic aspect in the project – financial strategies, plans, and project team will closely work with donors, water resource management associations, etc.

Mr. Mukhtar Tultabayev (Ministry of Environment, Kazakhstan) emphasized the fact, that Kazakhstan is very much dependent on water from other countries. In Ili-Balkhash basin, 80% of water comes from China. Therefore an agreement on water use with China is very important. There are also climate changes expected in the next decades, so the countries should work with intl. organizations, as there are common/regional problems to be solved with joint efforts.

Mr. Maksim Marsov (Committee of Water Resources, Kazakhstan) confirmed that there is an ongoing dialogue within a Joint Commission of Kazakhstan and China on transboundary rivers. There were discussions on monitoring, quality and quantity of water, but there is lacking consensus on common standards and approaches. Physically, it is hard to achieve water security without transboundary dialogue for Kazakhstan, as most waters are transboundary, so negotiations are ongoing with all neighboring countries.

Mr. Ulugbek Islamov (UNDP-Uzbekistan) informed about the IWRM activities in Uzbekistan. New UNDP IWRM project is starting. The project has three components: 1) improvement of legal framework; 2) improving utilities for water supply in Zeravshan basin; 3) development of IWRM plan in the same basin. It is foreseen to develop 14 different strategies, dealing with water balance among all sectors, including irrigated agriculture, utilities, energy sector and hydropower, industrial sector, dealing also with climate changes issues – change of water regimes in Zeravshan, etc.

Mr. Talaipek Makeyev (CAREC) pointed out, that the legal framework should be addressed and harmonized within the region.

Ms. Omina Islamova (SDC) expressed interest of SDC in working with Zeravshan as transboundary basin. If there is a similar project in Tajikistan, the basin could be also a pilot project to reach agreement on transboundary level and Switzerland would be able to support this process.

Session 3: Cooperation and Coordination with Key Partners and other Initiatives

Chair: Natalia Alexeeva (UNDP-BRC)

In this session the representatives of donor and partner organizations informed about ongoing activities and results, to be taken into account when preparing detailed work plan for the EU-UNDP project.

Ms. Delphine Marie (EU Delegation) pointed out that there are many opportunities for links with results of past, ongoing and future projects in pipeline. The specific issue is a National Policy Dialogue (NPD), which EC is funding implemented by UNECE and OECD in Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan and Turkmenistan, and exploring possibilities in Uzbekistan. NPDs are led and coordinated by countries and it is important to ensure complementarity of projects. The joint EU-UNDP project can be seen as well feeding into this, having working groups on different water related aspects, it fits in term of technical assistance and mechanisms and process.

Mr. Fedor Klimtchouk (UNRCCA) pointed out that the project has an important component on transboundary dialogue, which has supporting effect at political level aimed at sustainable agreement on water and energy resources management in the region. UN RCCA has been established for 5 CA countries and identified 3 priorities for the workplan 2009-2011 and the management of water resources in Central Asia is one of them, so the Center has organized a series of events with partners to enhance dialogue on water issues. There is a plan for the next year to intensify interstate dialogues in Central Asia and UNRCCA will provide relevant assistance so this might be done in close cooperation with all partners including UNDP and EU.

Mr. Volker Frobarth (GTZ) informed about the programme of German Ministry of Foreign Affairs "Transboundary Water Management in CA" implemented by GTZ, which consists of three major

components: 1) institutional reform / IFAS; 2) management of small transboundary rivers; 3) national pilot projects implementation in all 5 CA countries. The Programme is set-up in the countries and can cooperate with respective national components, but cannot provide co-funding to other projects.

Mr. Marton Krasznai (UNECE) confirmed the importance of NPD. The UNECE will continue to support NPD on IWRM within the EU Water Initiative. Such dialogue is ongoing in Kyrgyzstan; Tajikistan and Turkmenistan had expressed interest in it and are expected to start NPD in 2010. UNECE in cooperation with GTZ is providing support to the strengthening of regional institutions for water resources management, in particular EC-IFAS and the modernization of legal frameworks. The first outline of Aral Sea Basin Program-3, recently presented to donors, focuses, among others, on IWRM at the river-basin and regional level.

Mr. Christophe Bosch (World Bank) informed about the latest initiatives in the region and expressed interest to cooperate. There is a progress on partnership UNDP/WB/EU and donors are working closer together. As an example, a new program with UN-EC-WB has been recently launched to improve weather, climate and hydrological service delivery in CA. In CA countries WB has several ongoing projects on water resources management and infrastructure rehabilitation, so there might be cooperation potential. Summarizing, there is pipeline and portfolio of above 1 billion USD funded by the World Bank and governments. Therefore synergies of WB projects and IWRM projects are important. WB has some resources to work on Ill-Balkhash component, so it is possible to use WB offices in China for building connections and supporting transboundary dialogue in the basin.

Ms. Omina Islamova (SDC) informed about the SDC programme which started 9 years ago and relevant Switzerland's commitments in the region. In this context a ground is prepared for EU-UNDP project and SDC would support the regional dialogue and institutions. SDC has tools and specific packages on IWRM and going to upscale and replicate the activities.

Mr. Terje Helland (OSCE) welcomed the EU-UNDP project in the region and more specifically planned work on Ill-Balkhash region in Kazakhstan. OSCE would like to cooperate and has been already working on IWRM. A training IWRM module has been developed and it is planned to be implemented in Kazakhstan next year. Kazakhstan has chairmanship in OSCE for 2010 that will raise awareness on water and security issues in CA.

Mr. Andrey Barannik (USAID) informed about the activities of USAID in the water and energy sector. Since early nineties, USAID stimulated and facilitated a number of water agreements. From regional level USAID moved to national and local level. However, there is a new development since last year and a new strategy for Central Asia will be developed. USAID will continue its activities, based on what was achieved on regional and country basis, coordinating with our clients in countries and coordinate with other donors like WB, EU, GTZ, SDC, etc. on national and regional level.

Mr. Giovanni Munoz (FAO) informed about possibilities of FAO to cooperate, not as donor, through technical input, as there will be activities related to irrigation in EU-UNDP project. In last two decades in Central Asia, FAO provided already support to governments in improvement and modernization of irrigation schemes. In last two years, based on experience in many countries, FAO has a synthesized approaches and developing a methodology called MASKOT, which is a tool for prioritizing of large investments on irrigation. FAO has also a regular program in CA where this methodology will be introduced. FAO has several projects on irrigation advisory services and increasing irrigation efficiency in Uzbekistan, Tajikistan and Kyrgyzstan.

Ms. Yelena Yerzhakovich (UNESCO) informed about the UNESCO IWRM training programme developed in Kazakhstan, which might be replicated also in Kyrgyzstan and Tajikistan.

Mr. Talaipek Makeyev (CAREC) informed that CAREC is implementing two projects in the region on harmonization of water standards and approximation to European standards, improvement of water quality management in Central Asia. There are some outcomes that can be used also by other partners from the region: the state of legislation and water standards and state of water

quality in CA region. CAREC has also a project on payment for ecosystem services, this is a pilot project under Water convention. Practicing of payment for ecosystem services in CA could provide solution for some of water related problems in countries of CA.

CAREC was running a technical secretariat in Ili-Balkhash and activities were finished in April 2009, supporting also the basin council. Data and results and outcomes are available. Therefore it is important to identify if the EU-UNDP project could continue similar operations to avoid any type of overlapping.

Mr. Iskandar Mirhashimov (CAREC) shared the outcomes of the Ili-Balkhas project. The project provided institutional platform for cooperation of three countries. The key outputs were integrated management plan accepted by the Government of Kazakhstan and also draft trilateral international agreement on Ili-Balkhash basin (Kazakhstan, China and Kyrgyzstan) accepted by the Government of Kazakhstan as a legal basis for transboundary integrated management of the basin. For the creation of a management body for the basin a complete package of documents has been prepared and submitted to the key ministries.

Mr. Juerg Staudenmann shortly introduced the CAWSCI (Central Asian Waste Sector Coordination Initiative) and pointed out that its updates will be continuing and this will be done in close cooperation with EC IFAS on the regional level.

Mr. Henning Johansen (Embassy of Norway) confirmed the interest of Norwegian government in activities in CA region in coming years. There will be funds available and water management is one of the important issues. CAWSCI should be used to get information about ongoing activities.

Follow up:

Based on the discussions, Ms. Natalia Alexeeva briefed on the next steps: there is need to develop detailed plan of activities, update indicators and logical framework. National and regional IWRM inception seminars will help to finalize all details and agree on coordination. The document will be circulated for discussions and comments in December 2009.

Project Steering Committee meeting will be held on 19 November and then at least twice a year to address the need in cooperation, coordination and effective project implementation.



FIRST MEETING OF THE STEERING COMMITTEE

MEETING REPORT

The first, constitutional Steering Committee meeting was chaired by Mr. Haoliang Xu, UN Resident Coordinator - UNDP Resident Representative in Kazakhstan.

Mr. Haoliang Xu opened the meeting by welcoming all participants, presenting the draft agenda (annex 1) and outlining major discussions points for the meeting. The agenda was adopted by all participants.

Ms. Natalia Alexeeva, Regional Project Manager presented the management structure, project team and implementation procedures of the project, a joint EU-UNDP initiative (i.e. funded by the EU and implemented by UNDP Regional Center and country offices in Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan and Tajikistan).

As next item on the agenda, the Terms of References (TOR) for the Steering Committee (SC) was discussed.

Key comments and discussed issues focused on:

- The modality to pass decisions;
- SC composition and membership;
- SC meetings' legitimacy, and the possibility to arrange additional meetings if there is a need;
- Tasks of the SC;
- Improvement of wording and formulations in the draft TOR.

Based on the achieved consensus on these points, and pending their reflection in a revised version of the TOR (annex 3), the present members approved the TOR for the SC. With that, the Project Steering Committee was established and enforced.

Mr. Giovanni Munoz (FAO Regional Centre) requested FAO to be included as SC observer, offering the organization's extensive expertise and in view of planned and ongoing activities mainly in the irrigation sector. This request was supported by the SC members.

Ms. Natalia Alexeeva gave an overview over the project activities and plans (annex 5). She referred to the draft inception report (annex 4) and noted that the project's main achievements to date, being in the inception phase still, includes the establishment of the project team, development of implementation structures and draft work plans. Furthermore, and due to the number of other water-related initiatives and developments in water sector, communication and alignment with national stakeholders, international organizations and other stakeholders took more time than initially foreseen, leading to a slight delay and draft format of project documents and plans. The regional component planning will be developed in cooperation with the EC IFAS and taking into account recent developments in regional cooperation.

The presented reports and project plans were overall adopted. However, the SC asked the project team to further elaborate on the presented materials and plans in more details, including the establishment of measurable outcomes and indicators. It was decided that the project team will circulate all requested documents in mid-December to all project board members and observers.

Ms. Delphine Marie (EU Delegation in Almaty) underlined the need to coordinate project activities with National Policy Dialogue process in Kyrgyzstan and Tajikistan; this was supported by other SC members and acknowledged by the project team.

As last item on the agenda the SC decided to aim for a second SC meeting around May/June 2010 in Kyrgyzstan, which was welcomed by the Kyrgyz delegation.

The meeting was closed by the Chair.

Summary of the Steering Committee decisions:

1. The project team will update the TOR for the SC based on the discussion and agreements, to be circulated and approved by all SC members, in mid December 2009;
2. FAO will be included as observer to the SC;
3. The presented work plan and documents were adopted in general. The project team is asked to further develop and elaborate on them in more details, and to circulate them together with a detailed logical framework with measurable indicators and results in mid-December 2009.
4. The next SC meeting will be organized in Kyrgyzstan around May-June 2010.

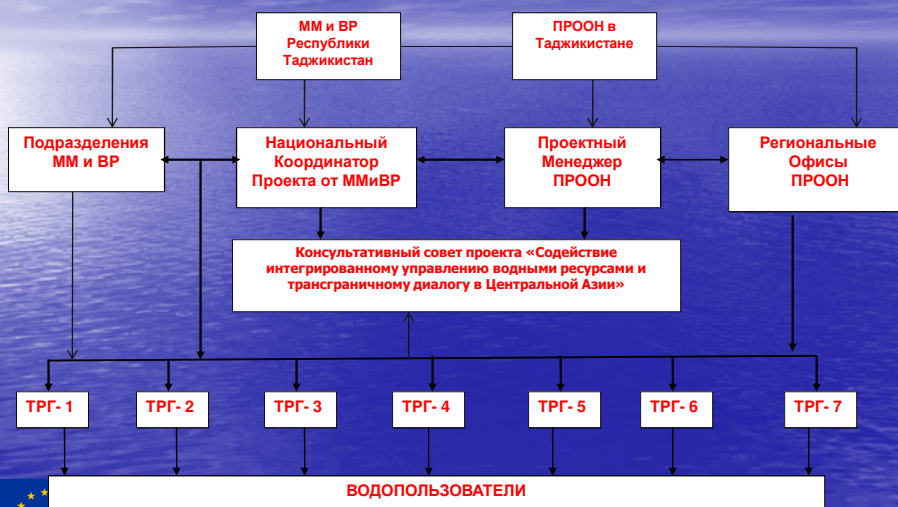

- Facilitate and propose joint operations based on existing Ili-Balkhash river basin (RB) master plans and state programs with all relevant elements.
